Are your wheels too tyred to drive?

It's important to regularly check your tyres to see if they're fit and healthy to help you get from A to B safely.

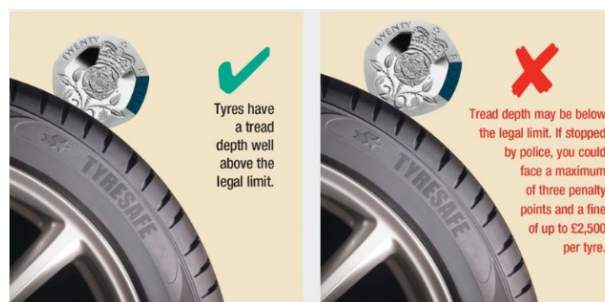
Check your tyres regularly. We recommend weekly vehicle checks which include inspecting tyre pressure, tread depth and the overall condition.

Ensure that your tyre's tread depth is at least 1.6mm for a car (however, we recommend 3mm), and 1mm across 3/4 of the width of the tread pattern and with

visible tread on the remaining 1/4 for motorcycles over 50cc. If your motorcycle is up to 50cc, all the grooves of the original tread pattern must be clearly visible.

The 20p test – check your tyre tread with a 20p by placing it into the main groove of your tyre. The outer band of the 20p coin should be obscured when it is inserted. TyreSafe have produced a great example of this:

Make sure your tyres have the correct pressure. You can find this information in



the vehicle manufacturers' handbook, on the inside of the fuel filler cap or driver's door sill, and you can get this information when purchasing tyres. You can find out

more information by visiting the TyreSafe website.

Associate Coordinator's Corner

As this is the first Newsletter following the end of the IAM Year 1st April 2018 to 31st March 2019, it is appropriate to give you the statistics for that year.

During that year, we generated 15 Tests with 11 Passes and four Fails. Four of the 11 Passes were 'First's'. Since the Group began in 1985, we have had 655 Passes and 62 Fails, which equates to a Pass rate of about 90% - a testimony to the excellent work done by Observers over the years.

I am writing this before I know any of the results of those who joined us in January.

To those of you who have done the

Test, I hope that you have got the result you were hoping for. If you would like to know more about Observing, then speak to Ken Nevittt. If you wish to learn more about the Training Support Team, then speak to Kay Heppenstall or Phil Sharples. Some of you who have passed the Test may like to have another attempt to try to achieve the IAM First; as you have already paid for a year's Membership then there would just be the Test fee to pay.

If the Test went wrong and you want a re-test, the same applies.

It is of course quite likely that some of you will be leaving us, so I would like to thank you for completing the

Course and I wish you well for the future.

To those of you who may still be waiting to take the Test, remember that if your drive is safe, systematic, smooth and progressive then you will Pass. Most of our Fails are due to the Candidates not complying with the law, particularly speed limits. Whatever the result, you will receive a very full debrief and a copy of the Examiner's Mark Sheet. I will end by wishing those of you who have yet to take the Test all the very best.
