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ADVANCED DRIVER COURSE

Chairman/Chief Observer Report

I am very pleased to report that the first six months of 2017 have once again produced record results for the Lincoln Group both in terms of new associates and test passes.

During this period we recruited 38 new associates and we expect this trend to continue for the rest of the year. At the same time we have achieved 22 advance test passes, compared with 33 for the whole of 2016, whilst maintaining a 100% pass rate and beating all the IAM's key success targets.

We currently have 42 associates in training; 6 of which are test ready and awaiting test dates.

Overall a great situation which has only been achieved through a combination of our very successful external presentations and networking, our promotion of Taster Drives and a lot of hard work by our excellent observer team.

September Navigation Event

On **Saturday 16th September** we are going to meet at Wyevale Horncastle for an enjoyable afternoon.

Lincoln IAM are arranging a navigation event putting into practise those skills of navigation you honed recently while also having a fun run out into the Wolds. If however you didn't come to that evening don't worry, the navigation is very straightforward and if you can follow a map you'll succeed!

The route will be defined by Spot Heights so those of you slightly phased by the tulips in the last navigation challenge can relax!

We will provide you with a map and list of Spot Heights through which you must pass to arrive at the correct destination.

It is recommended that you enter as a team of at least two per car as one will need to keep an eye in the map while the other drives. If anyone who isn't an IAM member but a friend or relation would like to join us that will be great.

Please bring along a pencil/pen and a firm surface on which to rest your map which will make using the map easier.

We will charge a nominal entry fee which will go towards a prize for the first team to complete the course correctly in the shortest time; although the organisers would like to emphasise that this isn't a rally. Refreshments are available at Wyevale and also at the finish which will be a pub in the Wolds.

email the week before. Please **arrive in Horncastle by 2pm to receive your map & instructions.** Some IAM members will be at certain points along the route to check for accuracy of navigation and in case anyone has a problem.

Mobile phone numbers will be given to you for assistance if anyone gets lost or any other emergency occurs, however points will be deducted if help is sought!

Ideally you will not go wrong, you will not arrive too late at the finish or worse, too early. The route will be timed to an average speed & the challenge is to arrive as close your particular time, which you will be told at the start, as possible.

The afternoon will be fun, slightly challenging, with beautiful scenery & a possibility of using some roads you may not know.

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BAD AIR DAY?

Tyre safety paramount

A study conducted by IAM RoadSmart official partner, TyreSafe, revealed Britain's motorists could be spending up to £600 million on unnecessary fuel bills. Research suggests as many as 57% of car and van tyres on the roads are being driven below recommended inflation pressures, increasing vehicles' fuel consumption and the risk of being involved in an incident.

- Air Pressure has a decisive influence on the way your vehicle accelerates, brakes and corners
- Safe tyres with the correct air pressure can reduce the risks to you, your passengers and all road users

F1RST for Fordie
