George Damant

George passed his test in 1977, and has always been keen to promote advanced driving. I first came into contact with him in the 1990s when he came to my husband for an assessment in 1998. Again he had his driving checked to make sure he was up to standard in 2003, bringing the dog with him on a blanket in the back of the car

and indeed Emma and Andrew passed their basic test at the first attempt. Despite giving up driving, George has continued to support the group —being ably helped by his wife or his son Robert. George attended many meetings, right up to early 2014. However, he had a nasty fall and

insisted that his grandchildren learnt to drive with a driving instructor interested in the IAM

George was always appreciative of the work done by the committee and observers. He

went into Leicester Royal first, then to Sutton in the Elms Care Home, where he died. His wife Margaret was also a member of Leicester Group along with other members of the family also took their advanced test on George's insistence.

George and Margaret spent a few years in Plymouth in the `1980's, but both came back to our meetings afterwards. In 2013 George was awarded the Vincent Brooksbank Award for

observing. A dearly loved husband, father and grandfather passed away peacefully on September 1st 2016 aged 92 years. A guiding light to us and generous to all. He will be sadly missed.
